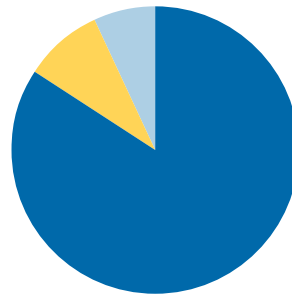

Fiscal Year 2010 Financial Report

KHC receives income from diverse public and private sources. The National Endowment for the Humanities remained the single most important source of income in 2010, providing 84% of Council revenues. The private sector provided 9%, with the remaining 7% coming from the State of Kansas. In 2010, Kansans contributed \$852,944 in Cost Share and In-Kind services. 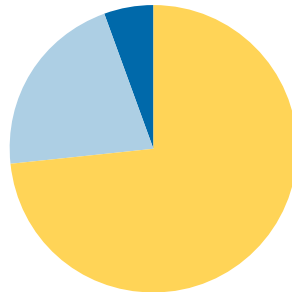
