**Kansas hosts needed for
Smithsonian Institution traveling exhibition**

Topeka – The Kansas Humanities Council seeks six Kansas hosts for the 2012-2013 Kansas Tour of the Smithsonian Institution traveling exhibition, “The Way We Worked.” Museums, public libraries, art centers, and other cultural organizations are invited to apply by June 30, 2011. The Smithsonian Institution is looking for host communities with populations fewer than 20,000.

“The Way We Worked” explores the stories of America’s workers and invites us to consider how the workplace and workforce have changed over time. Through photographs from the National Archives, audio and video clips, and hands-on components, Kansans will discover how, together, our work makes America.

“‘The Way We Worked’ offers Kansas communities a unique opportunity to host a Smithsonian Institution exhibition in their own hometown,” said Julie Mulvihill, executive director of the Kansas Humanities Council. “The exhibition also encourages communities to explore, preserve, and share local work stories.”
